CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION





EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The conference is designed to facilitate discussion on "best practices" in the diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of head and neck cancer patients throughout the world. The participation of Medical Oncologists, Radiation Oncologists, Radiologists, Pathologists and Head and Neck Surgeons will ensure educational interaction within and between specialties that can strengthen multi-disciplinary collaborative relationships.

At the conclusion of the event, participants will be able to:

- A. Discuss current therapeutic options for the head and neck cancer patient in a multidisciplinary environment, including:
 - 1. List the ways that induction chemotherapy and concurrent chemoradiotherapy impacts oncologic and functional outcomes of patient with advanced head and neck cancer.
 - 2. Compare the benefits and shortcomings of treating head and neck cancer patients with radiation delivery methods such as Intensity Modulated Radiotherapy or altered fractionation approaches.
 - 3. Critique the existing and potential roles of novel molecular-targeted agents in the treatment of head and neck cancer.
 - 4. Explain the role of functional imaging modalities in pre-treatment staging and assessment of treatment response.
 - 5. Describe the changing role of the surgeon in patients treated with primarily nonsurgical means.
 - 6. Review the impact of new breakthroughs in surgical technology including: 1) robotic surgery, 2) endoscopic approaches to the neck and thyroid gland, 3) image guided treatment of skull base neoplasms, 4) sentinel node mapping, 5) new reconstructive approaches, 5) new powered instrumentation and hemostatic devices.

- B. Summarize emerging research breakthroughs that are helping us to better understand the pathogenesis of head and neck cancer that will translate into improvements in the diagnosis, prognostication, and treatment of the head and neck cancer patient, including:
 - Novel high throughput laboratory approaches to analyze tumors and biofluids including whole genome sequencing, cDNA microrrays, array CGH, SNP arrays and integrative genomics.
 - 2. Animal models of head and neck cancer.
 - 3. The significance of human papilloma virus elements and or antibodies in tumors and biofluids.
 - 4. Pre-clinical evaluation of novel therapeutics.
 - 5. Early detection of oral pre-malignancy and cancer and chemopreventive approaches.
 - 6. The use of biomarkers in treatment selection.
- C. Recognize the vital role of nurses, speech pathologists, audiologists, nutritionists, social workers, pain specialists, mental health practitioners, physical therapists, dental oncologists in achieving maximal functional outcomes and proper functional assessment and reporting of functional results of new treatments programs.
- D. Describe the emerging emphasis in medicine on the quality, comparative effectiveness, and costs of health care delivery. Attendees will be able to discuss the following:
 - 1. The use of treatment guidelines including the NCCN treatment guidelines and adherence to treatment guidelines as a quality measure.
 - 2. How to establish a surgical quality and performance monitoring program.
 - 3. The impact of volume on quality of head and neck cancer care.
 - 4. The Physician Quality Reporting Initiative (PQRI) in head and neck cancer care.
 - 5. Incorporating quality into trainee/medical student education.
 - 6. The burden of Head and Neck Cancer in the developing world, and the challenges facing the international community.

ABOUT THE AMERICAN HEAD & NECK SOCIETY



HISTORY OF THE SOCIETY

On May 13, 1998, The American Head and Neck Society (AHNS) became the single largest organization in North America for the advancement of research and education in head and neck oncology. The merger of two societies, the American Society for Head and Neck Surgery and the Society of Head and Neck Surgeons, formed the American Head and Neck Society.

The contributions made by the two societies forming the AHNS are significant in the history of surgery in the United States. Dr. Hayes Martin conceived the Society of Head and Neck Surgeons in 1954, a surgeon considered by many to be the "father of modern head and neck tumor surgery." The purpose of the society was to exchange and advance the scientific knowledge relevant to the surgery of head and neck tumors (exclusive of brain surgery) with an emphasis on cancer of the head and neck. Two years later, The American Society for Head and Neck Surgery was organized with the goal to "facilitate and advance knowledge relevant to surgical treatment of diseases of the head and neck, including reconstruction and rehabilitation; promote advancement of the highest professional and ethical standards as they pertain to the practice of major head and neck surgery; and to honor those who have made major contributions in the field of head and neck surgery, or have aided in its advancement".

The new Society remains dedicated to the common goals of its parental organizations.

The purpose of this society is to promote and advance the knowledge of prevention, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of neoplasms and other diseases of the head and neck, to promote and advance research in diseases of the head and neck, and to promote and advance the highest professional and ethical standards.

HISTORY OF THE FEDERATION


Dr. Jatin P. Shah, of New York, conceived the establishment of an international body bringing together all specialists involved in the care of patients with Head and Neck Cancer worldwide. He presented this thought to the Executive Council of the Society of Head and Neck Surgeons, (SHNS) at its Retreat in the summer of 1985 and sought support from the SHNS. The proposal was received enthusiastically by the SHNS, and he was encouraged to proceed By August of 1986, leaders of Head and Neck Oncologic Societies worldwide were contacted to explore the feasibility of establishment of an International Federation of Head and Neck Oncologic Societies with the purpose of "establishing channels of communication to enhance exchange of information and improving knowledge as well as exploring new directions in the diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of patients with head and neck cancer". This proposal was enthusiastically received by leaders in the field from various parts of the world, culminating in the formation of a steering committee which met on May 1, 1987, at the Grosvenor House, in London. Representatives of sixteen Head and Neck Organizations from North America, South America, Europe, Africa and Asia were present. The steering committee drafted the constitution and bylaws of the Federation which was subsequently ratified by the Governing Council which consisted of one member from each member organization in the Federation. Dr. Jatin Shah was elected Secretary General by unanimous vote of the Governing Council.

Initial programs of the Federation consisted of enlarging the membership of the Federation with compilation of a newsletter, development of an international directory of members of component member societies and organization of World Congresses. Over the years the Federation has grown with a membership of 43 Head and Neck oncologic organizations, representing 65 countries, from every part of the world. Annual Newsletters were published initially, and these were eventually transitioned into an active and current Web site (www.ifhnos.org). The Federation is able to reach over 5000 specialists, located in nearly every corner of the world, providing care to patients with head and neck cancer through membership of its component societies. The Federation has successfully attained its initial goal and mission of establishing channels of communication to foster camaraderie amongst professionals involved in the care of patients with head and neck cancer.

Quadrennial World congresses of the Federation have been held since 1998, starting with the first World Congress in Mumbai, India in December 1997 under the leadership of Dr. Ashok Mehta. The second World Congress was held in December 2002 in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil under the leadership of Dr. Geraldo Matos D'Sa. The third World Congress was held in Prague, Czech Republic in June 2006 with Dr. Jan Betka as Congress President. The fourth World Congress was held in Seoul, Korea with Dr. Kwang Hyun Kim serving as President. The fifth World Congress will celebrate the Centennial of the Head and Neck Program at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York in July of 2014. Future congresses of the IFHNOS are planned for Buenos Aires in 2018, and Europe in 2022.

An innovative Global Continuing Medical Education program, "The IFHNOS World Tour", was introduced in 2008, offering a two and half day conference conducted by World leaders in the Head and Neck specialties, over five weeks. This program was offered in eleven countries around the world, beginning with London, Barcelona, Rome, Athens, Warsaw, Moscow, Mumbai, Beijing, Bangkok, Buenos Aires, and ending in Bogota. This highly successful education program was repeated in October 2010, with conferences in, Frankfurt, Antalya, St. Petersburg, Bangalore, Manila, Shanghai and Mexico City. The World Tour 2012 program was offered in Kiev, Amsterdam, Cairo, Ahmedabad, Guangzhou, Jakarta, Brisbane and Sao Paulo. This program will be repeated every two years, in the month of October, at different destinations worldwide.


